

"Is there an unlocked gun in your home?"

Asking about guns in the home is a simple way to prevent family fire.

Family fire refers to a shooting caused by someone having access to a gun from the home when they shouldn't have it, including children.

THE REALITY

Kids are curious about everything including guns. Talking about gun safety is a good first step but you can do more.



THE PROBLEM

Easy access to guns can lead to tragic consequences.

8 kids a day are unintentionally

injured or killed by family fire.

THE SOLUTION

Keep guns locked, unloaded, and seperate from ammunition. Before your child visits another home be sure to ASK, "Is there an unlocked gun in your home?"

Parents ask all sorts of questions before their children visit other homes. They ask about pets, discuss allergies, and ask questions about supervision. ASK encourages parents to add one more question to this conversation: "Is there an unlocked gun in your home?" It's a simple question but has the power to save a life.
